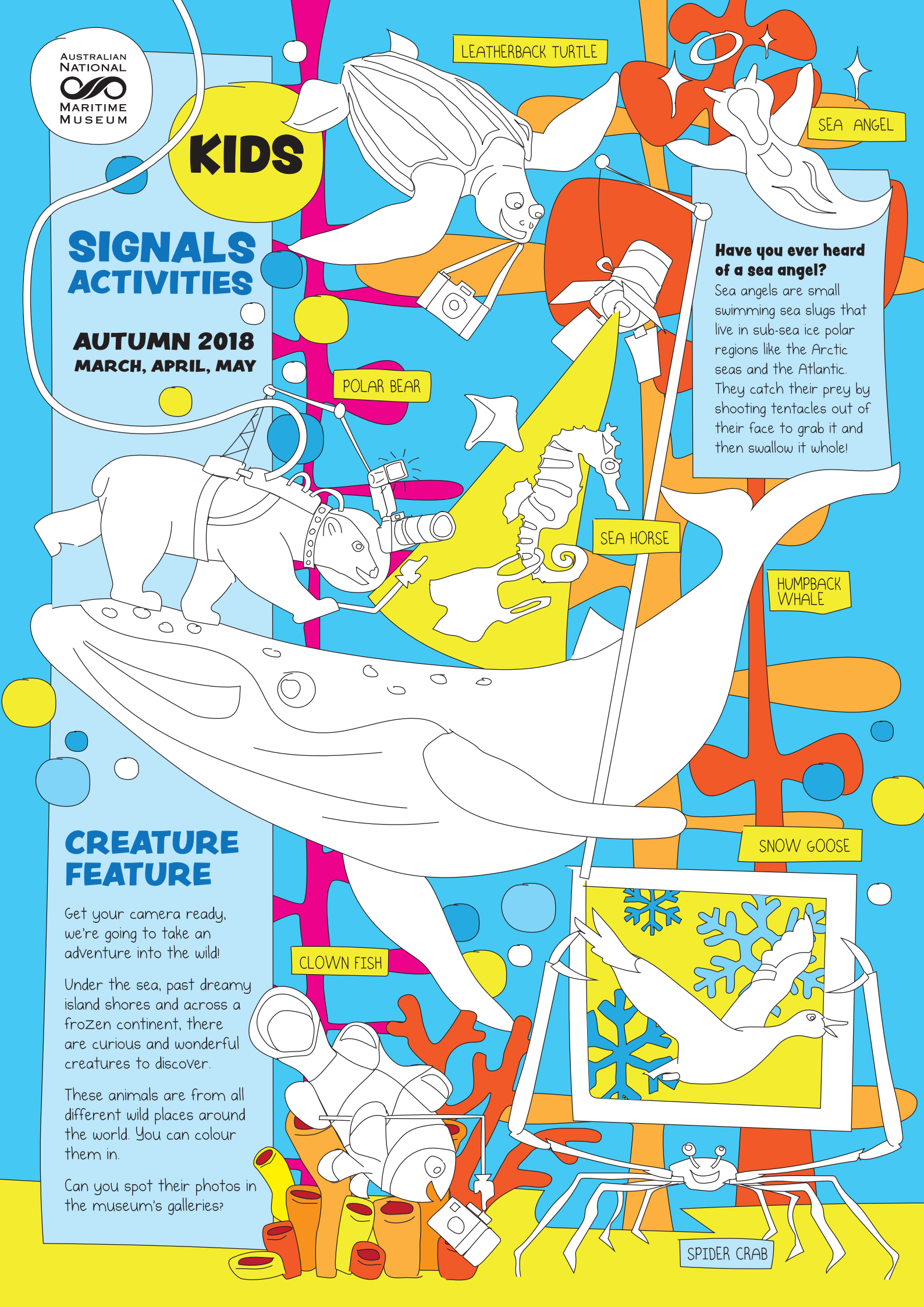
### CREATURE FEATURE

These animals are from all different wild places around the world. You can colour them in.

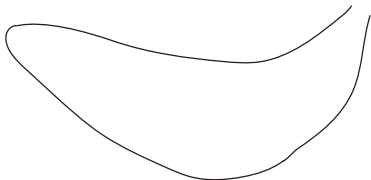

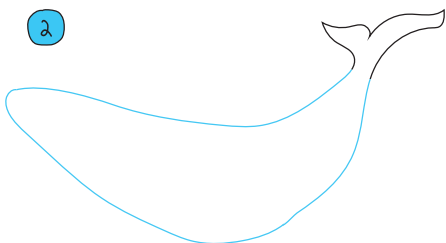
# HOW TO DRAW A HUMPBACK WHALE

Follow these simple steps to draw a humpback whale.

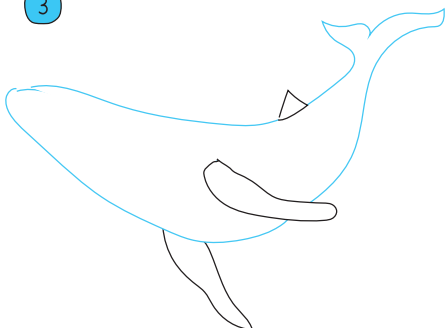

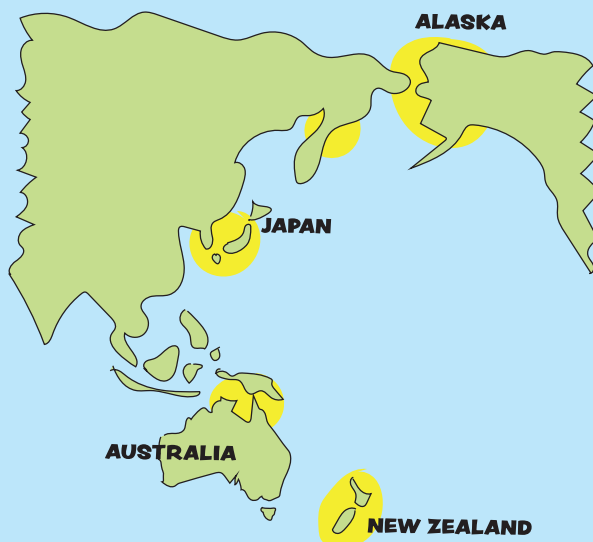
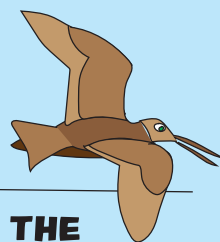
## TRAVELBUGS

In summer feeds in Antarctica, in autumn to winter migrates to warm tropical Pacific Ocean waters

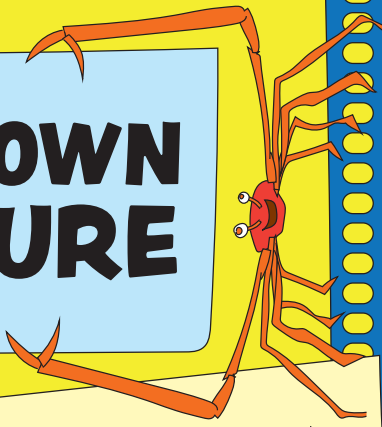


### THE GODWIT BIRD

In March the godwit bird leaves its feeding grounds in New Zealand and flies to northern Australia, then it goes to Japan in April/May, then to Alaska in May/June to breed, and it flies back to New Zealand in September.

What would your animal look like? What does its head look like? What about its body? Does it have a tail? Does it have wings, legs or flippers?

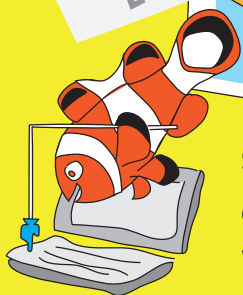
What does your animal eat?
