

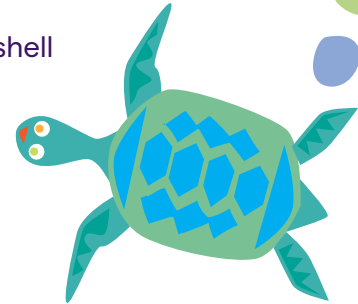
MATERIALS



- turtle template
- small piece of ghost net or rope for your turtle shell
- eye stickers (or other materials for eyes eg. wiggle eyes, collage paper, bottle caps)
- cotton twine or some pipecleaners
- plastic needles

OPTIONAL MATERIALS

- Crayons or pencils to decorate with
- PVA Glue (if you are sticking on shell materials instead of lacing them on)
- other recycled materials eg. bottle caps , rope, fabrics



INSTRUCTIONS



STEP 1 DECORATE YOUR TURTLE

Use crayons/ pencils to decorate the flippers and head of your template.

TIP: If you are using sticker eyes, put them on before you use crayons.



METHOD 2 PIPE CLEANER LACING

Scrunch net into a ball in the centre of the turtle. Use pipe cleaners to lace through the holes in the template and secure the shell onto the turtle.



STEP 2 MAKE YOUR TURTLE SHELL

Your turtle shell could be made of almost any recycled materials. We've used ghost net & rope here but if you are making this at school or at home, feel free to experiment.



METHOD 3 RECYCLED MATERIALS

Plastic bottle lids make a terrific turtle shell. Ask an adult to help make holes in the bottle caps for lacing them onto your template with string, or use PVA glue to fix down the caps.



METHOD 1 - GHOST NET WOVEN SHELL

Twist a piece of ghost net in your fingers and coil it around into a spiral. Use twine/string and your needle to stitch the spiral together. This can be as neat or as messy as you like. Attach the coiled shell to your turtle using the holes in the template and some more twine.
