The National Monument to Migration is a tribute to all those who have travelled to Australia and settled here to start a new life. The National Monument to Migration is made up of a series of bronze panels and has names permanently engraved into the surface. The Monument is located on the northern side of the museum building opposite Pyrmont Bay.
As part of this project, the museum maintains a database. In order to share this important heritage information, this database is accessible through the museum's website www.sea.museum .
To date, there are more than 30,000 names registered on the National Monument to Migration. As the database develops, with thousands of entries spanning more than two centuries, it increasingly represents stories of the rich migration heritage that makes Australia what it is today.
